




# The Amnesty Program has been Extended!

Don't wait for the last minute to get your Amnesty registrations in and take the chance of missing the deadline again. The Amnesty Program includes *late transfers* as well as *late registrations*. Transfers over 60 days and registrations for sheep over 1 year of

age are \$6.00/head. If you know of an individual that would like to join the association or has not been active within in the last few years, now is a great time to get flocks current!

Larry L. Becher, 68, of Fort Dodge, IA died Saturday December 17, 2011 at his home.

Funeral services were 10:30 Wednesday, Dec-ember 21, 2011 in the chapel of the Laufersweiler-Sievers Funeral Home with Rev. Michael Carmody, pastor of New Covenant Christian Church, and family friend Mez Verol, officiating. Burial was in the North Lawn Cemetery.

Survivors include his wife, Cynthia and his son, Travis of Fort Dodge; cousins, Roberta Becher and Donny Becher both of Fort Dodge.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Lorence and Pauline (Delamore) Becher; and his daughter Tiffany Becher.
