

## **MacCauley Foundation Scholarship**

**Application Deadline: February 1** 

The MacCauley Foundation scholarship offers up to \$38,500 annually in scholarship funds that are awarded to qualified applicants. Seven individual scholarships may be awarded at the following monetary levels: \$10,000, \$7,500, \$6,500, \$5,000, \$4,000, \$3,000, and \$2,500.

#### **Eligibility:**

- 1. Applicants must have owned and/or raised Suffolk sheep.
- 2. Applicants must be enrolled as one of the following for the term in which the scholarship will be awarded:
  - A freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior in a junior/community college, four-year college/university, trade school or other accredited institution of higher education
  - An accredited graduate program
- 3. The applicant cannot have exceeded their 25th birthday prior to January 1 of the year of application.
- 4. If selected to receive a scholarship, the recipient will be required to verify their enrollment in an institution of higher education before the scholarship can be issued; a copy of the current semester tuition bill or a current Bursar's Office statement must be submitted. Failure to meet the enrollment requirements may result in forfeiture of the scholarship.
- 5. Should the recipient fail to complete at least one semester of full-time enrollment in an accredited or approved institution of higher education prior to June 30, 2025, for any reason, scholarship funds must be refunded to the MacCauley Foundation Scholarship Fund.
- Scholarship award winners will be eligible to reapply but can only be awarded a cumulative total of \$15,000.

#### **Application Requirements**

- 1. The application must be accompanied by 3 letters of recommendation/reference. The letters of recommendation must include the name, address and daytime phone number of the person making the recommendation as well as the person's relationship to the applicant (e.g., teacher, employer, minister, etc.).
  - Family members may not serve as references for the applicant.
  - References should indicate knowledge of the applicant's character and determination to pursue a post-secondary education.
  - All references must be submitted electronically with the application.
  - No exceptions to the reference letters requirement are allowed.
- 2. Each applicant must furnish a recent high-quality headshot photograph in a jpeg format. The photo should only include the applicant. These will be used for news releases.

#### Interview

Finalist(s) will be selected from the applications received and may have a phone interview with the Scholarship Committee.

#### **Scholarship Payment**

All eligible young breeders are encouraged to apply. Funds will be paid directly to the winner's college or university and may be used for academic pursuits only.

If selected to receive a scholarship, the recipient will be required to verify their enrollment in an institution of higher education before the scholarship can be issued; a copy of the current semester tuition bill or a current Bursar's Office statement must be submitted. Failure to meet the enrollment requirements may result in forfeiture of the scholarship.

Should the recipient fail to complete at least one semester of full-time enrollment in an accredited or approved institution of higher education prior to June 30, 2025, for any reason, scholarship funds must be refunded to the MacCauley Foundation Scholarship Fund.

This scholarship shall not be given if qualified applicants are not available or if the application is not of sufficient quality to warrant this scholarship. Awards are based on participation, volunteerism, and academic achievement as determined from the application and letters of recommendation. This judgment is based solely on the discretion of the Scholarship Committee.

#### **Application Submission**

- 1. Applications must be submitted by the applicant, completed in full, accompanied by all required documentation, and submitted via email to info@suffolks.org. Only one submission will be accepted in a calendar year.
- 2. The entire application and supplemental documents must be submitted by February 1 no later than 11:59 p.m. EST. The auto-generated email inbox date and time will serve as the timestamp for all applications submitted via email.
- 3. All applicants will receive an email receipt confirming delivery of the Scholarship application. Scholarships will be announced by April 1.
